## SERVICES FOR CHILDREN

**Psychological or Psychiatric Evaluation** the evaluator can then recommend a variety of things:

- **Family Based Mental Health Services** to provide individual & structural family therapy for up to 32 weeks, child must be at risk for psychiatric hospitalization or out of home placement.
- **Behavioral Health Rehabilitation Services** – includes a Behavioral Specialist Consultant (BSC), mobile Therapist, and Therapeutic Staff Support (TSS) provided in the home, school & community to provide support to the family to prevent more restrictive/intrusive treatment.
- **Social Skills Group** – provided to individuals that have an Autism Spectrum Disorder diagnosis to help them gain social skills.
- **Community Residential Rehabilitation (CRR) or Therapeutic Foster Home** – a specially trained foster family who receives weekly therapeutic support for the child. Can only be recommended by a psychiatrist.
- **Residential Treatment Facility**
- **Outpatient Therapy**

- **These services cannot start without an ISPT meeting (parents, caseworker, child if over 14 & other service agencies) and approval by Value Health. Services must be reviewed every 6 months & approved by Value)**
- **Sexual Trauma and Assault Services (STARS)**
- **Parent Child Interactional Therapy (PCIT)** parent training that teaches parents behavior management techniques to use for the 2-7 year old children.
- **Early Intervention, Child Alert, Head Start**
- Parents to request an evaluation for an **Individualized Education Plan (IEP)**
- **Family Group Decision Making Meeting** (typically on behalf of an older child).
- **Administrative Case Manager** – lowest level of case management that provides resources to the child/adolescent/family upon request & make referrals to appropriate service providers.
- **Blended Case Manager** – a higher level of case management that provides advocacy and support to the family on a minimum of 1x monthly.
- **Independent Living Services**
- **After School Programs** – to help with providing structure after school, which would include help with homework.
- **Child Centered Activities** (i.e.: Scouts, sports, dance, music, etc.).

## **CYS Requirements**

- **Family Service Plan (FSP)** – details the things the family must do. This is for when the child is placed with the parents. Must be a new one done every 6 months & must be filed with the court. There is a signatory page & parents can either agree or disagree or not sign this. Older children will also play a role & sign off on this plan.
- **Child Permanency Plan (CPP)** – details the things the family must do. This is for when the child is in out of home placement. Must be a new one done every 6 months & must be filed with the court. There is a signatory page & parents can either agree or disagree or not sign this. Older children will also play a role & sign off on this plan.
- **Family Findings** – CYS is required by law to do Accurint/Diligent Searches for family members as support for the family/child.
